# **MEDIA CENTER/TEXTBOOK DEPOSITORY**

## **HOME ACCESS VIEW RIGHTS**

Students and parents may now view their Pioneer Media Center and Book Depository loan records from home. Utilizing Destiny, a web based program, and their student log-in name and student ID number, students and parents may now review at any time what items are still on loan and what fines or obligations, if any, have been applied. Please note: obligations must still be cleared from wherever the item was borrowed – either the Media Center or the Book Depository.

### **DIRECTIONS FOR HOME ACCESS**

From the Pioneer website home page:

- Click on the MEDIA CENTER link in the left navigation bar.
- Click on the CATALOG link in the next webpage.
- Click on the LOG-IN box in the upper right hand corner to open a new webpage.

LOG-IN using the same information that students use to access student server space. Remember that it is case sensitive.

### **VIEWING THE CHECKOUT RECORD**

By default, the screen opens to search the catalog of PHS Media Center. In the top navigation bar on the left side, beneath Pioneer High School, Ann Arbor MI, is the MY INFO button.

Clicking on this button will allow you to view the ITEMS OUT from both the Media Center [Library Materials] and Book Depository [Textbooks].

It will also give you information on fines posted to your account. Media Center fines are 10 cents per day and max out at \$1.00 for each book that is late, while textbook fines represent replacement cost for a damaged or lost textbook. Both our Media Center and Book Depository charge for lost or damaged books. Receipts are provided for payment by cash or check only. Checks must be payable to: Pioneer High School. No credit cards are accepted at this time.

Under ITEMS OUT you will see: date due; title of item; book price and date checked out. The Pioneer Media Center and Textbook Depository utilize different due dates.

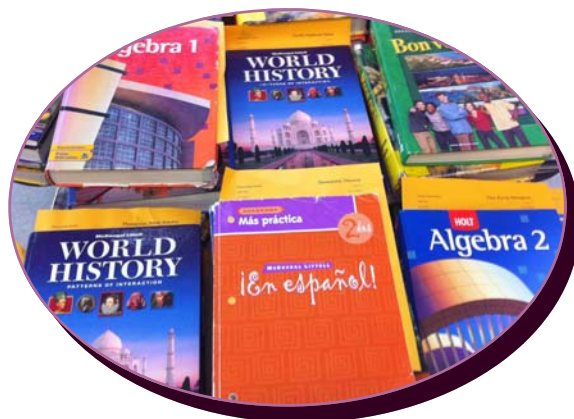

## College Prep Workshops

Neutral Zone and The Princeton Review have teamed up to present a series of college admissions preparation workshops. All workshops are FREE and do not require pre-registration. **Wednesday, March 9- College Admission Workshop**, 5pm at Neutral Zone

This workshop will go over how to find the best college for you. Learn about the college admissions process, what schools are looking for in their applicants, and why certain colleges are very selective.

**Wednesday, March 23 - Admission and Standardized Test Essay Workshop**

5pm at Princeton Review, 1220 S. University, Suite 102, Ann Arbor

This workshop covers exactly what is required on your standardized test essay to achieve a perfect score. Learn the differences between the essay portion on the ACT and SAT, as well as what schools are looking for on admission essays.

## Poetry Slams

Pioneer High School is the site for the third semi-final round in the **2011 Ann Arbor Youth Poetry Slam**. The event will be held on Thursday, March 17, at 7 p.m. in the Little Theater. Admission is free and open to the public. Come and cheer on Pioneer students as they vie for a spot in the line-up at the city-wide slam finals.

Neutral Zone hosts the city-wide **2011 Ann Arbor Youth Poetry Slam Finals** on Thursday, March 24 at 6:30 p.m. The best local teen poets and spoken word artists, winners of the four semi-finals held over the past month, compete for one of six coveted spots and the opportunity to represent Ann Arbor at the 2011 Brave New Voices national youth poetry slam competition in San Francisco this summer. Come early as this is usually a standing room only crowd! Admission is open to the public. Admission fee is \$5 students/\$7 general public. The Neutral Zone is located at 310 E. ## Knuckleheads Book Release

Pioneer teacher and Neutral Zone's Literary Arts Director, Jeff Kass, grew tired of hearing from his male students that they don't like reading or have never finished a book so he decided to do something about it. He wrote a collection of stories expressly for them to read.

"Knuckleheads" will be released at a special event on Thursday, March 31, at 7 p.m. at the Neutral Zone. Kass will read from the short story collection and books will be available for purchase. The event is free and open to the public.

"It's not like no one has ever done this before," says Kass. "Junot Diaz, Lewis Robinson, for instance, these writers have written terrific stories that young males adore, but I just wanted to add to what's already out there. Wanted to create a collection that kids who are in my classroom could potentially fall in love with."

Kass says he loves the word "knucklehead" because it's sometimes an insult and sometimes a term of endearment and sometimes something in between. "Boys and men do a lot of goofy things as we try to figure out who we are," Kass says. "Sometimes we need to recognize there's a kind of beauty to our screw-ups, a kind of admirable sense of perseverance that goes along with the improbable things we hope for."

While Kass believes the book can have a general audience, he really hopes it will go viral among young males and become a kind of Salinger-esque cult classic for them to treasure. "Reading is one of the primary ways we develop empathy," Kass says. "If we write off young males as readers and don't create literature that appeals to them, what are we saying about the kind of people we want them to turn into?"
